Black beer

Smooth on the palate and refreshing with a dry finish, Easy drinking with a sweet body.

Wheat beer dark

Similar to a Hefeweizen, these southern German wheat beers are brewed as darker versions (Dunkel means "dark") with deliciously complex malts and a low balancing bitterness. Creamy and full-bodied.

Wheat Bock

The German-style Weizenbock is a wheat version of a German-Style Bock. With flavors of bready malt and dark fruits like plum, raisin, and grape, this style is low on bitterness and high on carbonation. Balanced clove-like phenols and fruity, banana-like esters produce a well-rounded aroma.

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Alt Bier

A Düsseldorf specialty, an Altbier is a German-style Brown Ale. The word alt literally translates to "old" in German, and traditionally Altbiers are conditioned for a longer than normal periods of time. Taste is smooth and clean, carbonation is moderate, and while known to express the slightly spicy, herbal character of Noble hops, the key word here is balance.

Porter

Porter is a style of dark beer that originated in England during the 1700s. These beers are known for their deep ruby brown to black color, dark malts that often impart chocolate and caramel flavors, and well-balanced, hearty characteristics.

Bock dark

Bock beer is a strong lager style invented in Germany in the 14th century. It is named after Einbeck, the small village where it was created. Bock is traditionally a clear lager, tasting malty and sweet.

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Doppelbock dark

"Doppel" meaning "double," this style is a bigger and stronger version of the lower-gravity German-Style Bock beers. Originally made by monks in Munich, the Doppelbock beer style is very food-friendly and rich in melanoidins reminiscent of toasted bread. Color is copper to dark brown. Malty sweetness is dominant.

Kölsch

First this style was brewed in Köln (Cologne), Germany. It is light to medium in body with a soft mouthfeel and a straw yellow or pale gold color. Kölsch has a light herbal Noble hop bitterness and a crisp, dry finish.

Weissbeer pale

Weizenbier or Hefeweizen, in the southern parts of Bavaria called Weißbier (literally "white beer")

It has a low hop bitterness (about 15 IBUs) and relatively high carbonation. Taste is very smooth, often with hints of banana, clove or bread dough.
